Reading Together.

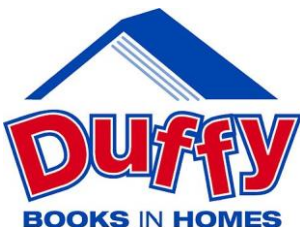
