Fees: First two sessions free. Then \$2 per session (total of \$10.00)

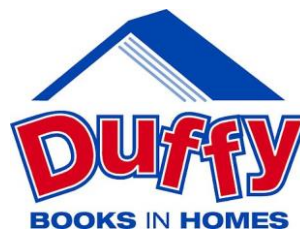
